- Globalisation
 - productivity, innovation-based growth,
- Demographic shifts
 - ageing, shrinking workforce, migration
- Social inclusion,
 - increasing diversity in work, health and wellbeing of the population.

 - of the 241 million European workers and their families



The platform

- A consortium of Swedish OSH researchers, supported by the social partners and national agencies.
- Funded by Vinnova-the Swedish Innovation Agency
- Launched in 2013
- Coordinated from Karolinska Institutet, Stockholm



- Strengthen synergies between
 - research centres of excellence in Sweden and the rest of Europe
 - researchers and the social partners and other stakeholders through in-depth dialogue
- Increase scope for research on sustainable and innovative work in
 - Horizon 2020 (and FP9)
 - European structural funds (especially European Social Fund)
- Enhance knowledge about opportunities for European research funding among Swedish researchers
